



Tertini Wines scoops up several awards

TERTINI Wines is making a name for itself in an international arena.

The Southern Highlands wine producer has added three international medals to its growing collection of awards and accolades.

Tertini walked away from the Hong Kong International Wine Challenge with three medals for its 2005 riesling, 2008 noble Riesling and 2006 pinot noir.

The 2005 riesling was the highest scoring riesling from NSW and the equal highest scoring white wine from NSW.

Tertini Wines sales manager Robert Kay said Hong Kong and China were still only regarded as emerging markets, but they were already in the top five destinations for most wine exporting countries.

"The massive potential these markets represent is attracting all the world's major, as well as many small, producers and they see success at the challenge as an important source of recognition for their wines in these markets," he said.

Mr Kay has also accepted an invitation to take part in a NSW Wine Showcase Trade Mission

organised by the NSW Department of Primary Industries in conjunction with Austrade and exhibited in Hong Kong and Shanghai.

"We were delighted that our 2006 pinot noir was chosen for the NSW Wine Showcase dinner in Hong Kong, which featured the most celebrated avant-garde chef in Asia, Alvin Leung, and Sean Connelly from the Austral in Sydney," Mr Kay said.

"Our 2005 Tertini riesling was also chosen for a trade workshop at the Hong Kong Fair where it was described as an outstanding example of the grape variety in NSW."
